



#### The Origin and History of Chinese New Year: WHEN START AND WHY

**C**hinese New Year, also known as the Lunar New Year or the Spring Festival, is the most important among the traditional Chinese festivals. The origin of the Chinese New Year Festival can be traced back to about 3,500 years ago. Chinese New Year has evolved over a long period of time and its customs have undergone a long development process.

### A Legend of the Origin of Chinese New Year

Like all traditional festivals in China, Chinese New Year is steeped with stories and myths. One of the most popular is about the mythical *beast Nian* (/nyen/), who ate livestock, crops, and even people on the eve of a new year. (It's interesting that Nian, the 'yearly beast', sounds the same as 'year' in Chinese.) To prevent Nian from attacking people and causing destruction, people put food at their doors for Nian. It's said that a wise old man figured out that Nian was



scared of loud noises (firecrackers) and the color red. Then, people put red lanterns and red scrolls on their windows and doors to stop Nian from coming inside, and crackled bamboo (later replaced by firecrackers) to scare Nian away. The monster Nian never showed up again.

### Chinese New Year's Origin: In the Shang Dynasty

Chinese New Year has enjoyed a history of about 3,500 years. Its exact beginning is not recorded. Some people believe that Chinese New Year originated in the *Shang Dynasty (1600–1046 BC)*, when people held sacrificial ceremonies in honor of gods and ancestors at the beginning or the end of each year.

#### Chinese Calendar "Year" Established: In the Zhou Dynasty

The term *Nian* ('year') first appeared in the *Zhou Dynasty* (1046–256 BC). It had become a custom to offer sacrifices to ancestors or gods, and to worship nature in order to bless harvests at the turn of the year.

#### Chinese New Year Date Was Fixed: In the Han Dynasty

The date of the festival, the first day of the first month in the Chinese lunar calendar, was fixed in the *Han Dynasty (202 BC – 220 AD)*. Certain celebration activities became popular, such as burning bamboo to make a loud cracking sound.

### In the Wei and Jin Dynasties

In the *Wei and Jin dynasties (220–420)*, apart from worshiping gods and ancestors, people began to entertain themselves. The customs of a family getting together to clean their house, having dinner, and staying up late on New Year's Eve originated among common people.

#### More Chinese New Year Activities: From the Tang to Qing Dynasties

The prosperity of economies and cultures during the *Tang, Song, and Qing dynasties* accelerated the development of the **Spring Festival.** The customs during the festival became similar to those of modern times.

Setting off firecrackers, visiting relatives and friends, and eating dumplings became important





### INGREDIENTS

- 1 15.25-ounce box of chocolate cake mix (plus ingredients listed on box)
- 1 7-ounce jar of marshmallow creme
- 2 tablespoons water
- 1 11.25 ounce of chocolate fudge sauce
- 1 8-ounce tub of whipped topping, thawed
- 2 packets of hot chocolate mix <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup
- 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups mini marshmallows
- 2 tablespoons mini chocolate chips



### INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Prepare the cake in a  $9 \times 13$ -inch pan following the directions on the box. Allow the cake to cool to room temperature.
- 2. Use the handle of a wooden spoon or the thick end of a chopstick to poke rows of holes into the cake 1 inch apart.
- 3. Add the marshmallow fluff and water to a microwave-safe bowl and microwave for 20 seconds. Mix until well incorporated. The marshmallow fluff should be a pourable consistency. If it is too thick to pour, microwave for an additional 10 seconds and stir well again.
- 4. Pour the marshmallow creme over the cake. Use a rubber spatula or the back of a spoon to spread the marshmallow and press it down into the holes.

parts of the celebration.

**More entertaining activities arose**, such as watching **dragon** and **lion dances** during the Temple Fair and enjoying lantern shows.

The function of the **Spring Festival** changed from a religious one to entertaining and social ones, more like that of today.

### In Modern Times

In 1912, the government decided to abolish Chinese New Year and the lunar calendar, but ad-



opted the Gregorian calendar instead and made January 1 the official start of the new year. After 1949, Chinese New Year was renamed to **the Spring Festival**. It was listed as a nationwide public holiday.

Nowadays, many traditional activities are disappearing but new trends have been generated. CCTV (China Central Television) **Spring Festival Gala**, shopping online, WeChat red envelopes, fireworks show, and overseas travel make Chinese New Year more interesting and colorful.

- 5. Heat the chocolate fudge sauce according to the directions on the jar. Spread the chocolate sauce over the top of the cake. Allow the fudge sauce to cool.



- Add the whipped topping and hot chocolate mix to a medium bowl and gently fold until well combined.
- Spread the chocolate whipped topping over the cake and refrigerate for at least an hour to allow the flavors to meld.
- 8. When ready to serve, sprinkle the mini marshmallows and chocolate chips over the cake, slice and enjoy.

**n December 31**, when the clock strikes midnight, **January 1** will be here, and we'll all ring in the New Year. Have you ever wondered why we celebrate each new year on January 1? *We answer this question with help from History.com and EarthSky.* 

Believe it or not, New Year's Day wasn't always celebrated on Jan. 1. According to *EarthSky*, the earliest recording of a new year celebration is believed to have been in Mesopotamia in 2000 B.C., but it was celebrated during the vernal equinox or mid March. Later, the ancient Egyptians, Phoenicians and Persians would celebrate their new year with the autumnal equinox, or mid-September, while the ancient Greeks celebrated on the winter solstice or mid-December.

The first time New Year's Day was celebrated on Jan. 1 was in 45 B.C. During his reign as a Roman dictator, Julius Caesar reformed the traditional Roman calendar with help from Sosigenes, an Alexandrian astronomer. Following the solar year, the new calendar calculated a year to be 365 and <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> days long. *That year, 45 B.C., Caesar added 67 days so that the new year would begin on Jan. 1.* 

The ancient Romans celebrated their New Year's Day with a feast for the god of doorways and beginnings, Janus. The Roman god had two faces, one looking to the past and one to the future.

In the Middle Ages, when it was discovered that Caesar and Sosigenes made a slight mistake in the calendar calculation, many stopped following the dictator's calendar. In the 1570s, Pope Gregory XIII commissioned Christopher Clavius, a Jesuit astronomer, to fix the 11-minute mistake and, in 1582, the Gregorian calendar was implemented. Since then, Jan. 1 has become widely accepted as the New Year.

Tomorrow's celebration not only follows the December solstice, or the shortest day of the year, but it is also when Earth is closest the sun in its orbit. And so, because the days will now begin to grow longer and the Gregorian calendar deems it, Jan. 1 is when we celebrate the new year, a natural day for new beginnings.


